WHEREAS, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) nationally ordered narrow band channelization in the VHF and UHF bands, which require deployment of narrow band transmitting and receiving equipment, including radio base stations and pagers, by the end of December, 2012; and

WHEREAS, the 9-1-1 Central Dispatch/Emergency Management Department has been purchasing and deploying narrow band capable transmitters and pagers for its fire service and EMS dispatching operations since the year 2000 to meet the FCC deadline; and

WHEREAS, purchase of Minitor pagers has been planned for and approved in the 2010 budget; and

WHEREAS, the Purchasing Department coordinated this year's cooperative bid; and

WHEREAS, SAT Radio Communications, LTD, dba Industrial Communications of San Antonio, Texas submitted the lowest price per unit; and

WHEREAS, the approaching FCC deadline may soon impact availability and pricing; narrow band capable Minitor pagers can be purchased this year at a significant discount if purchased in quantity; and

WHEREAS, this purchase will conclude the eleven-year-long project.

WHEREAS, the Livingston County Building Department has the primary purpose of assuring that buildings are sound, safe and sanitary through the enforcement of the State Building Code; and

WHEREAS, for the year ending December 31, 2009, the number of permits issued by the Livingston County Building Department was 3,724, down from 5,252 for the same period in 2008, a decrease of 29%; and

WHEREAS, in 2009 the number of inspections decreased 42% from 2008; and

WHEREAS, this decrease in the number of services led to a 46% decrease in revenue and necessitated the use of \$286,780 of departmental retained earnings to cover the cost of operations for 2009; and

WHEREAS, the continued erosion of retained earnings is unsustainable; and

WHEREAS, proactive corrective action appears to be necessary since there has been no correction in the downward trend in the building market.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners hereby concurs with the recommendation of the Finance Committee that it is now necessary to institute the following workforce reduction effective March 15, 2010.
